Minutes of 2021 AGM and matters arising.	The minutes had been circulated and no matters had been raised. The minutes were therefore accepted by those present as a true record. These will be signed by the Chairman and Secretary.
Chairman's Report	Thank you everyone for attending this evening and making us quorate!! Firstly, I would like to thank all the members of the committee for their hard work and support throughout the past year. So, what have we done over the last year, the reality is not a huge amount. Due to the ending of
	lockdown and the ongoing uncertainty we really didn't plan that much. Firstly, we ensured all our senior tutors were still up to standard and then all our tutors were given a check run. Once they were completed, we started our core business of tutoring. We advertised to all members that we would be having an assessment day at the Honda Centre in Shrewsbury and members could book with us to go out and have a tutor follow them and give an assessment of their ride. In

previous years this has proved popular, this year no one took us up on the offer, so the day was cancelled. This was disheartening and disappointing.

We had a stand at Bike4life at Cosford and as some of you are aware it was the last outing of our Gazebo due to it being blown away. We asked for volunteers to help set up and run the stand, once again no one came forward, but thanks must go to members of the committee for enabling us to run the stand. I am dismayed and disheartened at the lack of assistance to run the club events as this is a recurring theme throughout the past year. It always seems to be the same faces (i.e. the committee or ex-committee members) who support events.

The Ride outs have started again and we have struggled to get a Ride Leader and Tail End Charlie to run these events. These are a good opportunity to meet other members and potentially recruit new riders who want to improve their riding skills and work towards taking the advanced test. I would like to thank Charles Bridgeman for his efforts as Ride out Co-ordinator and a big thank you to Ken Swinton who has stepped in recently to cover for Charles. If members do not put themselves forward to help, then the ride outs will not happen.

We had a stand at the Forden Bike Show, and it gave us an opportunity to use our newly purchased gazebo. Another big thank you to Ken for all his hard work finding and organising the purchase/delivery of the gazebo there are pictures on the website. We had several enquiries and Kev will be following these up.

I would like to thank Robin Padgett who is standing down as Training Co-ordinator this year Robin has had worked hard to try to match tutors with associates and I am aware at times this has been very difficult so thank you Robin for all your hard work throughout this year and previous years. Kevin will be taking on the role merging it with being the Training Officer.

Congratulations to Martin Powell who most of you will know on passing his RoSPA Level 3 and Level 4 awards coaching and he will be joining us as a tutor for this coming year.

Lastly a thank you to all the committee who have worked so hard this year and still agreed to remain as committee members for the coming year. I look forward to working with you this coming year.

Hopefully more members will put themselves forward to help and it will not be so disheartening.

	This is my first year as training officer after taking over the role from Stuart McMillan. Stuart
	has left us with an excellent benchmark to work with going forward and was presented with
	the 'Glyn Jones' award for his dedication and commitment to our group when he attended
	our first tutor meeting of 2022. Stuart has remained a SaPAR member and group tutor.
	The group's primary objective is to offer voluntary Advanced Motorcycle Training to new and
	current members, and continue to promote road safety. I am confident that we will
	continue to offer training of the highest possible standard. We currently have four senior
	tutors who together have the experience and the necessary credentials to advise and
	support our dedicated and conscientious group tutors.
	The year started with a senior tutors meeting in December, then a tutors meeting in
	February and followed by senior tutor and group tutor riding assessments during
	Feb/March, prior to resuming training. It was encouraging that we had an excellent turnout
	and positive feedback from both our senior and group tutors. Senior tutors will offer
	support to their newly allocated group tutors and will now offer pre-test assessments to
	associate members and full members.
	All tutors have been issued with two size option Hi-Viz vests and will encourage their
	associates to wear them during training sessions in order to increase safety and promote
	our group. Tutors were also issued with up to date Roadcraft/Highway Code books and a
	SaPAR Motorcycling Roadcraft Essential Reading index revised version.
	A sub-committee arranged a member's only assessment day at the Honda Centre in April but
	unfortunately this was cancelled due to lack of support from our members. We will
	hopefully arrange a similar event next year but will have to take a different marketing
	approach.
	Due to various reasons our tutor numbers have fallen over the past couple of years.
	However, we do have a new tutor training program in place and will endeavour to recruit
	and train potential tutors in the future. We currently have 9 active tutors which includes a
	welcome back to Martin Powell who has also taken on a senior tutor role. Martin is a RoSPA
	examiner and our regional RoSPA coordinator so he will be a great asset to our group.
	Howard has taken a rest from his senior tutor role but will remain a member of SaPAR and
	said he will join our ride outs from time to time.
	There was a slow start to associates in training this year but as the summer progressed we
	began to see a lot more activity on the tutor calendar. I myself have found it difficult to find
	a fully committed associate and will be looking at a new method of running the associate

waiting and holding lists. The senior tutors have kept proactive by carrying out 'try before you buy free assessments', 'pre-test assessments' and 'tutor refresher assessments. Our 'try before you buy free assessments' offer has become very popular and has helped us gain new members and I recommend we continue to promote this in the future.
Please see Robin's report for associates in training and test results etc. Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Bill, Rob, Howard, Martin, Robin, Group Tutors and the Committee for their support and look forward to continue working with them.
